We want to give you a glimpse into the inner-workings of how we create a culture of caring to give the aging the most sacred gift imaginable — a spectacular life.

We begin with the understanding that our quality of care depends upon us tapping into the full potential of those who are on the front lines of caregiving. We rely on seminars and workshops, with our Holocaust training the most sacred for these special homes of ours. We teach our caregivers to be mindful that when they see numbers on a resident's arm, this means that person is a Holocaust survivor and the first words out of their mouths needs to be: "I'm so sorry." This is just one example of the kind of "cultural sensitivity" we delve into with our Holocaust trainings.

We also train our caregivers to align themselves deeply with our "No One Dies Alone" policy. As Rabbi Cantor Arlene Bernstein puts it, "It's a sad privilege to be an angel walking the dying to the edge of this life."

If family members are not able to be with their loved one, our caregivers know how important it is to fulfill this sad privilege and are ready and willing to step in with dignity and grace.

Celebrating milestones with vitality is another rite of passage at Seacrest that we and our associates hold dear. In fact, recently a member of our life enrichment team helped a resident and his wife celebrate their wedding anniversary with a candlelight dinner. The associate was sensitive to the needs of the memory-challenged husband, supplying him with roses to give to his wife.

Finally, our staff is shown a model of caregiving beyond 9 to 5, one that creates the deepest of bonds with the residents. I'm proud to report that when a resident recently died who had lived at Seacrest for the past 18 years, at least half a dozen caregivers went to his funeral, many on their day off.

Seacrest, like an iceberg, has some aspects of it hidden beneath the sea of life. What lies above the sea, easily distinguishable, is our dynamic expansion guided by our exhaustive research. We use the best and brightest minds in our leadership to tap into this research and help us draw up a blueprint for our projects.

Through our 75 years of caring with compassion, we want to thank our founders, our leadership, our donors and our community for the vision, generosity and steadfast commitment to honor those who have come before us.

While we forge ahead with our research and our inventive ideas to serve our cherished Jewish community, we wanted to share our stories hidden beneath the surface to let you know that we will always consider our most prized capital our caregivers. In the years to come we are as committed as ever to invest in this capital to make good on our sacred gift for each and every resident — a spectacular life.

When we live life like it's a race, it's impossible to win. That's because when we live life on the run it's a blur; we're preoccupied with the details of life — dates, times, budgets.

But then something monumental happens — the loss of a loved one, an illness, or a tragic accident — and then we're faced with our life in limbo. At this point we don't have to be prompted; we naturally re-evaluate our entire existence. We're in a state of metamorphosis because our eyes are no longer on the details of life but on the grand journey, where it's taking us and who we are meant to be on this Earth.

Rabbi Daniel Cohen wrote the book What Will They Say About You When You Are Gone? and it's a book for those pondering the big questions in life. I was delighted with the response I got from a few residents at Seacrest when I posed these questions: What do you want your legacy to be? How do you want others to remember you?

Sylvia: "I want to be remembered for being pleasant, funny, great to talk to, for being a good listener, and for being humble."

Pauline: "I want to be remembered for being kind, nice, for always having a smile and for how grateful I am for my life, my family and my friends. I want to be remembered as a mother, grandmother, great grandmother, and as a woman who is blessed."

Eve: "I want to be remembered for my gratitude, my humility, and for how blessed I am to live my last years in a community that gives me sustenance and takes care of all my needs."

Another heartfelt question the rabbi poses in the book is: If you knew you only had 24 hours left to live, how would you spend that time? Here's what a Seacrest resident and an associate said:

Martin: "I would want to be in the comfort of my own home with my wife, our parents and our immediate family."

Sylvia: "I would want to be with my daughter at the beach, walking and appreciating the sunshine."

Don't wait for a loss, an illness or a tragic accident to ponder these monumental questions, because only when you consider how you want to die will you begin to consider how you want to live.



Seacrest at Home is almost five years of age. Our core service is a top notch home care program. Home care is defined as non-medical help with activities of daily living (cooking, dressing, feeding, shopping, bathing, companionship, medication reminders, light housekeeping, transportation, etc.)

Additionally, Seacrest at Home has added two new programs to its offerings:

- C.A.R.E. or Companion Available Ready for Emergency: a companion will stay with your loved one in the emergency room or while hospitalized
- Care Navigation: A Registered Nurse will act as a knowledgeable coordinator of your loved one's care through the maze of our US healthcare system as well as community services

What is missing from our portfolio of services at home is home health services. Home health is the provision of medical services (medication management, skilled nursing, physiotherapy, etc.) in the home by licensed healthcare professionals, in contrast to home care services which are entirely non-medical and do not require a professional license.

The Board of Seacrest at Home is currently exploring the acquisition of a Medicare certification to offer home health services. This certification is expensive and difficult to obtain, though is reimbursed by Medicare or private insurance.

We are also pursuing the application for licensure for home health. Licensed home health is considered private duty and paid for privately or reimbursed by long-term care Insurance. It is not billable to Medicare or Medi-Cal. Licensed home health personnel are professional staff offering skilled services such as wound care, IV therapy, medication management and rehab services. All services have physician over-sight.

As we know, most seniors desire to remain in their home as they age, and many cannot afford the cost of a senior living community.

Therefore Seacrest at Home supportive services are in demand and Seacrest at Home, with its pristine brand recognition for high quality services in the context of Jewish values, will continue to thrive in San Diego County.

Finally, given our program needs, Seacrest at Home appreciates the many San Diegans who continue to be philanthropically generous to Seacrest at Home.

Special Memories Shared Between Jewish Communal Colleagues

Sol and Pearl Reitman were one of the first couples to move to Seacrest Village in Encinitas when it opened in the late 80s. They are remembered fondly, especially in the Assisted Living building, their love and strong bond being one of the reasons Seacrest knew it needed to raise funds to build the muchneeded Assisted Living Residence so that couples could remain together as their needs changed. They

lived together for many years in independent living, until Sol needed more assistance than Pearl could provide. When the assisted living facility opened, they moved there together and were able to stay in their beautiful home of Seacrest and stay with each other, as they had been for 60 years. By the time she passed away, just shy of 102 incredible years, Pearl had lived in and received care in every level of care Seacrest offered.

Their grandson, Steven Reitman, is now on staff at Jewish Family Service, San Diego. As Jewish Family Service (JFS) celebrates its centennial year, the staff of Seacrest wish Steve and the entire organization a warm mazal tov on 100 years of helping San Diegans live safe, healthy, independent lives at every age, values that are shared strongly by Seacrest Foundation.

Shona Borevitz, who is the Director of Philanthropy for Seacrest Foundation, recalls telling Steve, "I actually found my job at Seacrest through the JFS Career Services program, and I am so grateful for this." Shona and Steve enjoy a working relationship, as they both work in philanthropy, which brought Steve to tell Shona the story of his grandparents' time at Seacrest.

As Seacrest celebrates its 75th Anniversary year of serving the frail and elderly in our Jewish community, we look back at the history we share. The woman who is credited with having started JFS was also part of the group of women, called the Jolly 16, who some years later would start the San Diego Hebrew Home for the Aged (the first name that the current Seacrest Village had when it opened in 1944). After a

committed life of serving those in need, she actually lived the last years of her life at Seacrest Village in Encinitas.

Steve explained to Shona that his grandparents were living in a mobile home park in Escondido. They belonged to Adat Shalom and volunteered for Jewish organizations. As they grew older, they needed extra help but they were simply not able to afford it. This is where Seacrest came in. Steve's family went to Seacrest for help. Seacrest was just opening its Encinitas campus and because of the scholarship program, his grandparents were able to move to a brandnew community, into a new apartment and make it their home. They became part of a vibrant Jewish community, and felt supported, peaceful and happy. In fact, Pearl's sister, Regina, soon joined them and the three of them became a very special part of the Seacrest family for many years. Pearl and Regina worked in the Seacrest

gift shop, selling greeting cards, gifts, and snacks to residents and visitors.

As Seacrest looks back on 75 years of being a life-line in the community, we think of the impact that has been made on so many families like the Reitmans. Some of our beloved residents, like Pearl and Sol, are spoken about and missed to this day. Pearl is




Rising Leaders: Planting Seeds for the Future


